SAM2 Sign Management Policy and Risk Assessment

Implemented June 2022

Aim This document is intended to guide Old Hunstanton Parish Councillors / volunteers in their role as custodians and operators of the speed monitoring and data recording equipment (SAM2). It serves as an immediate speed awareness sign for motorists. Data is also collected and will be analysed and used to highlight and quantify excess speed, to inform the community and to add weight and justify any requests to the Police for speed limit safety enforcement activity.

Operation Battery charge life is usually sufficient for 4 weeks whilst new and will diminish to about 3 weeks as the battery nears the end of its life. If when analysing the data it is apparent that a battery is discharged before 3 weeks, then it should be notified to Westcotec. If at any time the battery becomes excessively hot when charging it should be switched off and Westcotec notified. The expected life of the batteries is 4 years and replacement should be factored into the financial budget.

2	Collision with moving vehicles	People injured whilst installing/ removing the equipment	Volunteers handling the SAM2 and road users.	All volunteers to wear high visibility vest/ jackets when on the roadside. Signs only to be fixed or moved in daylight hours. All approved sites are within the 30 mph zones. All volunteers to exercise situational awareness.	High Risk No further action needed
3	Distracting moving vehicles	Risk of collision between vehicles or with pedestrians	Pedestrians and vehicle users	SAM2 only to be deployed in approved sites. When fitting signs volunteers are not to make hand signals or gestures to drivers of vehicles nor attempt to stop or direct traffic.	Medium Risk No further action needed

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4	Confrontation by the public	Risk to wellbeing and reputation	Volunteers and public	If confrontation occurs volunteers to stop activity, do not engage in the confrontation and if safety is at risk call 999. Consult with the clerk/chairman and report incident to the Police via police website if deemed appropriate.	Low Risk The Parish Clerk must be notified of any incidents
5	Personal injury whilst installing, operating or removing the sign	Risk of personal injury	Volunteers	All volunteers to follow the installation guidance and manufacturer training issued by the Parish Clerk in line with the manufacturer's instructions. Only those who have received a copy of the risk assessment to carry out sign installation. All installation must be carried out by persons over the age of 18 years. Battery charging must be carried out in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Basic manual handling techniques should be used when handling the sign (sound footing and weight distribution, not over-reaching and keeping the sign close to the body rather than using extended reach and turn rather than twist the body). Should difficulty be experienced then stop and seek assistance/advice.	Medium Risk No further action needed
6	Data Protection	GDPR breach	Road users	The data captured is anonymous, only number of vehicles, speed and rate/time is recorded for analysis.	Low Risk No further action needed
7	Security of equipment	Loss or damage of the sign	Parish Council	Secure padlock to be used with approved brackets. SAM2 equipment to be insured.	Medium Risk No further action needed
